The NYC Elder Abuse Center's staff and partnering agencies work together to provide multidisciplinary training to professionals from across disciplines and systems on a wide range of topics related to elder abuse and aging, including how to present cases to the Brooklyn MDT. These presentations are lively and interactive, utilizing a variety of teaching methods – e.g., didactic presentations, discussions, case studies, DVDs - to appeal to different adult learning styles. Our staff will work to fit the needs of the audience, including physicians, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, nurses, attorneys, caseworkers and students.

Attending MDT Meetings

In addition to attending a training or presentation on elder abuse, it can also be beneficial to observe professionals from a wide range of disciplines actively coordinate responses to abuse. Students and professionals interested in learning more about utilizing a team approach to respond to elder abuse cases are invited to attend an EACCRT or Brooklyn MDT meeting.
